



The **Quay Bar** is open from one hour before performances.


BOOKING FEE

DIRECTIONS & PARKING

Sudbury is approximately 40 minutes from the A120, A12 and A14 and about 90 minutes from London. Using the venue postcode of **CO10 2AN** will bring Satnavs to Quay Lane. If you continue down Quay Lane, past the Cricket pitch on your right and the Tennis Club on your left, you will find the Quay at the end of the lane.

There is **free car parking for patrons** directly outside the theatre.

Sudbury has a railway station with hourly services to Marks Tey, which meets the mainline to Norwich heading north, and London Liverpool Street heading west.
