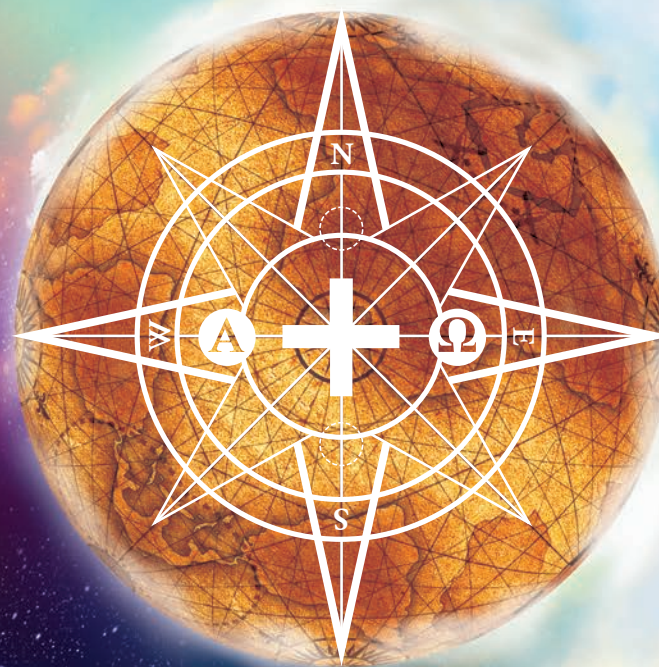

LENT, HOLY WEEK & EASTER AT LICHFIELD CATHEDRAL



Every Holy Week we symbolically act out the main gospel stories of Jesus's entry into Jerusalem on Palm Sunday, his conflict with the Temple authorities and his becoming a wanted man.

We remember his last meal with his friends, how he washed their feet and gave them a new commandment to love one another. We recall his agony as he awaited his betrayal and arrest.

Then on Good Friday, we mark his suffering, death and burial. The next day is an empty day when we recollect that Christ rested in the tomb, but on Easter Day we rejoice in the superb surprise of God raising Jesus from the dead and opening for us the way to life with him forever.

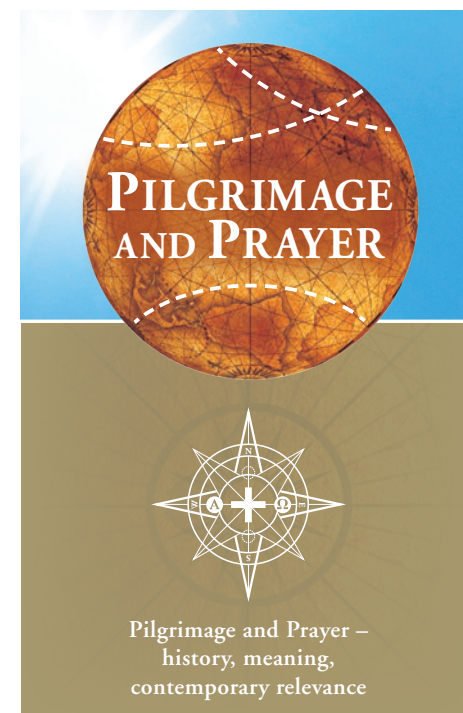
THROUGHOUT LENT

Prayer and Pilgrimage

**Monday 14 January – Thursday 28 February
10:00 – 16:30**

This intriguing exhibition begins our year of considering journeys in space, light and time. People of all faiths and of none recognise the role of pilgrimage in our lives. The exhibition explores how modern ideas build on the historical tradition of Christian pilgrimage, including pilgrimage to Lichfield Cathedral from the time of St Chad to the present day. Amongst the fascinating exhibits are a 14th-century document listing relics owned by the Cathedral, stonework linked with the mediaeval shrine of St Chad, a 1420 edition of Chaucer's 'Canterbury Tales', and a 17th-century casket which contained the relics of St Chad after the Reformation.

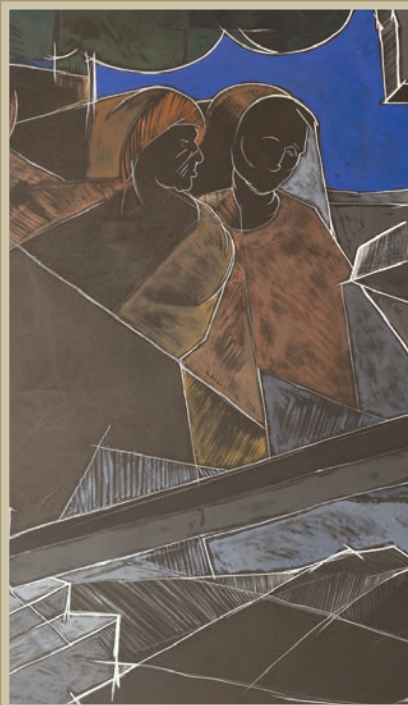

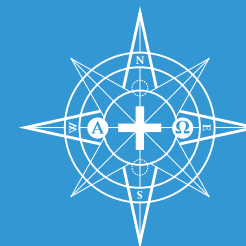

HOLY WEEK AND EASTER



Palm Sunday

Sunday 14 April

07:40 Morning Prayer (Lady Chapel)

08:00 Holy Eucharist with Sermon (Traditional Language) (Said)

10:30 Palm Sunday Procession and Liturgy of the Palms (meet at Speakers' Corner). The congregation gathers at Speakers' Corner by Minster Pool to begin the great ceremonies and drama of Holy Week.

We remember Jesus's entry into Jerusalem. Palm crosses are distributed and blessed, the Gospel is read and we follow a real live donkey to the Cathedral; the Cathedral banner and Cross will follow as we sing hymns.

11:00 Choral Eucharist of Palm Sunday with Children's Church followed by refreshments. The procession arrives at the Cathedral just before 11:00. We enter the Cathedral to hear the Gospel of the Passion and celebrate the Eucharist.

15:00 Choral Evensong for Palm Sunday with Lenten Homily

19:30 Service of Tenebrae – from light to darkness. A dramatic service of words and music led by our Chamber Choir – the most conspicuous feature of the service is the gradual extinguishing of candles and other lights in the church until only a single candle, considered a symbol of our Lord, remains. Toward the end of the service this candle is hidden, typifying the apparent victory of the forces of evil. At the very end, a loud noise is made, symbolizing the earthquake at the time of the resurrection (Matthew 28:2), the hidden candle is restored to its place, and by its light all depart in silence.

19:30 The Liturgy of Maundy Thursday with the Washing of the Feet, followed by the Watch at the Altar of Repose until Midnight. Maundy Thursday marks the beginning of the Great Three Days. This is a very rich liturgy. The Gospel speaks of love and service, which are also expressed in the ceremony of the foot washing. The New Testament reading records the institution of the Lord's Supper. The evening setting highlights the nearness of the betrayal and approaching passion of Jesus and we follow Jesus into the Garden of Gethsemane, heeding his call to his disciples to watch and pray with him. Dramatically, at the end of the service the Cathedral is ceremonially stripped of all its hangings.



HOLY WEEK AND EASTER

Good Friday

Friday 19 April

08:00 Morning Prayer

12:00 – 15:00 The Liturgy of Good Friday. This powerful and dramatic service marks the hours Jesus hung on the Cross. The service is in four parts, each lasting roughly 45 minutes. During the third section the congregation is invited to come forward and place their prayers and concerns on the life-sized cross that is carried into Church. People may stay for the whole 3 hours or attend one session, but we ask that you arrive and leave as quietly as possible.

11:30 – 15:30 The Cathedral is closed for sight-seeing

19:30 Churches Together Service. Join with Christians from all denominations and traditions in the united act of worship and prayer.

Holy Saturday

Saturday 20 April

Other than preparing and decorating for Easter, the building is kept dark and quiet as we reflect on Jesus lying in the stillness of his tomb after the Crucifixion. This is a good day to come to sit in silence and enjoy the spaciousness of the Cathedral.

09:30 Preparing the Preparers – a short service for those preparing the Cathedral for Easter Day.

16:30 A service of prayers in commemoration of the past Bishops of Lichfield – an informal service where we accompany Bishop Michael as he prays at the places where his predecessors are buried or remembered.

17:30 Evening Prayer and 'In Memoriam' commemorating all those in whose memory Easter lilies are dedicated.

Easter Sunday

Sunday 21 April

05:00 Easter Vigil and Holy Eucharist. The most important service in the Church calendar, full of light, drama and music. Gather in the early morning gloom and be among the first to witness the new light of Easter with the lighting of the New Fire and the great Paschal Candle. Hear the story of our salvation unfold as we sit in a short candlelit vigil awaiting the cry that Jesus is risen from the dead: fanfares, great celebration and a breakfast afterwards (for those who have booked). If you only do this once in your lifetime, you'll never forget the experience.

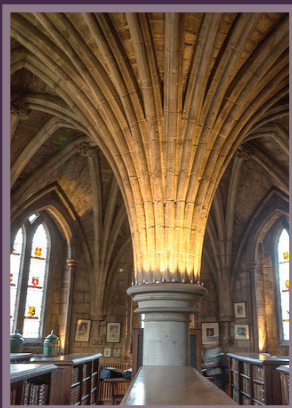

The Library, situated on the upper floor of our unique two-storey Chapter House, is one of the Cathedral's best-loved treasures. It houses a magnificent collection of early printed books and hand-copied manuscripts. Highlights include a 15th-century copy of Chaucer's *Canterbury Tales*, one of only three surviving hand-coloured 16th-century printed copies of Christopher Saxton's map book of Tudor England and Wales, and a manuscript set of orders signed by Charles I.

Following completion of restoration and repairs to the Chapter House roof, the Library is offering a limited number of public tours. Climb 35 spiral steps to the historic library and view some of our best books and manuscripts.

PEACE WOODLAND



Lichfield Cathedral has been working in partnership with Lichfield Historic Parks to create a new Peace Woodland in Beacon Park. The Peace Woodland will be a permanent living artwork created by Lichfield Cathedral's Artist-in-Residence, Peter Walker. During 2018, the Parks team and a great number of volunteers potted up 1,918 local trees. Planting began on 11 November 2018 to mark the centenary of the end of the First World War. Please do visit the Peace Woodland, which will open at Easter; a time to rejoice in new life, hope and the promise of peace on earth.
