The Rules

- 2 There are four age categories – Under 5's, 5 to 8 year olds. 8 to 11 year olds and 11 to 16 year olds.
- 3 There will be three winners in each category and a further three runners up in each category. If appropriate others will be recognised as highly commendable.
- 4 Entries will be judged by Cannock Chase Council.
- 5 The prizes will be top of the range Easter Eggs for the winners and an Easter goody bag for the runners up as well as certificates for those that are highly commended.
- 6 All the winning pictures will be on display in the Town Centre at in the run up to Easter.
- 7 The entries should be on A4 paper using felt pens, coloured pencils or paint with a name, address, telephone number and age of the child written clearly on the back of the drawing.
- 8 Entries can be posted to Market Office at Cannock Chase District Council, Civic Centre, P O Box 28 Beecroft Road, Cannock, WS11 1BG.
- 9 Entrants should note that it will not be possible to return their drawing.
- 10 Entrants should note that Cannock Chase Council may wish to use drawings in promotional material for a future Easter event.
- 11 The deadline for entries will be Friday 4 April 2014.
- 12 Judging will take place week commencing Monday 7 April 2014.
- 13 Winners will be notified on or after Monday 7th April 2014 and prizes distributed before Easter.
