May Queen Procession, Crowning and Fayre





The Metropolitan Police Male Voice Choir originated in 1872 and since 1945 has been providing its own brand of musical entertainment in this country and abroad. Its full complement of 30 members, all volunteers, is comprised of serving and retired officers of all ranks and civilian staff. The Choir has performed in all the major churches and halls in London, including St. Paul's Cathedral, Westminster Abbey and St. Martin-in-the Fields as well as the Royal Albert Hall, Fairfield Halls, Queen Elizabeth Hall, Guildhall, the Royal Festival Hall and the Barbican.

It performs concerts for many charities, primarily in London, but also in the provinces, and has toured Holland and Germany in recent years for major combined concerts. Over the years it has made numerous live and recorded TV appearances, including Songs of Praise and Flashmob the Opera [both for BBC] and has recorded several albums.

The programme will include a mix of popular favourites from Disney to Joplin, sing-along-medleys, traditional choral and operetta and a selection of solos from choir members.

HAMPSTEAD - A London Village with Banstead Coaches





London's richness and variety results from its growth as a tapestry of villages, each with its own character. Once a place of highwaymen, swinging gibbets and savage beasts, today Hampstead is select, opulent and full of stories.

After morning coffee and meeting our guide, we stroll gently down from Whitestone Pond, the highest point in London, through the lanes of old Hampstead – the Montmartre of London. Once the place of choice for the capital's artistic community, Hampstead village today has more millionaires within its boundaries than any other area of the UK. This pleasant and easy walk brings us back to a country-flavoured village pub for a roast-of-the-day lunch with dessert and coffee.

In the afternoon we take the scenic route to Kenwood House via the Hampstead Garden Suburb, an Experiment in Building for the whole community regardless of age, class or income. The highlight of our day will be a guided tour of Kenwood, 'London's most smiling mansion' [Simon Jenkins]. This magnificent country house, closed for restoration for the past two years, is now returned to its former glory. It contains some of architect Robert Adam's finest inspirations, including the library with its mirrors, columns and ceilings by Antonio Zucchi, the music room and the astonishing 'Chinese' chimneypiece in the Upper Hall. There is also a world-famous collection of paintings by such artists as Rembrandt, Vermeer, Gainsborough and Turner.

There will be free time to explore the house, enjoy the wonderful views across London and to buy tea in the cafe, before returning to the coach at 4.45 pm for the drive home.

NB The walking on this tour is approx 800 metres, spread throughout the day.

Coach leaves at 8.45 am from Banstead Library in the Horseshoe, returning about 6.30 pm

The cost will be £39.50 per person. This covers coach travel and all admissions, tour guides' services, morning coffee/tea and biscuits on arrival, roast-of-the-day and dessert pub lunch and gratuities for guide and coach driver.



Post-War Banstead

How the area changed after the Second World War



The end of the Second World War saw the iconic Woolpack Inn, the Forge and the surrounding buildings at the Eastern end of Banstead High Street damaged beyond repair. However, the spirit of recovery soon took over, with the next couple of decades seeing the the Banstead area change from a sleepy village into a vibrant community.

This evening we will look at the changes that laid the foundations of the Banstead we see today. We will look at various aspects such as schools, shops, developments, entertainment and the destruction of the remaining parts of old Banstead.
