Mick Burrows and Richard Gibbons met at a Wolverhampton acoustic music club around 2011. They can be found performing weekly in the folk and acoustic clubs in the Midlands area. Their first eponymous album was released in 2014.

1.55pm The Voqwells

Martin & Emma's music is a collection of stories woven with music heavily inspired by the traditional British folk style. Whether the subject is local legends or thoughts on the day to day, the core of the song is always a story.

2.30pm Chase Mist

This polished and exciting five-piece plays an eclectic mix of traditional and original songs and tunes with influences as diverse as The Jackson Five and Queen. Their latest album was released in December 2015. http://chasemist.bandcamp.com/

3.45pm Richard Digance

A BAFTA Nominated entertainer and a Gold Award recipient from The British Academy of Composers and Songwriters. During the '70s he toured and recorded with Chris Coe, was a member of the legendary New Victory Band & Bandoggs. In the late '80s and early '90s he toured and recorded with Red Shift. Since 1985 he's mainly worked as a soloist. His strong, distinctive voice is enhanced by the ringing strings of his bouzouki, the sweet chords of his mountain dulcimer, the plaintive frailing banjo & the pulsing reeds of his melodeon. He sings, plays & dances, sometimes all at once!

8.25pm Moore Moss Rutter



Tom Moore, Archie Churchill-Moss and Jack Rutter hail from three distinct regions of the UK - they combine musical material, style and tradition from Norfolk,

Somerset and Yorkshire respectively. Since 2009, Moore Moss Rutter have been playing as a trio, meticulously reworking English tunes and compositions into sets and songs which have been described as "intelligently crafted musical adventures". Often praised for musical "maturity and sophistication", it is their aim to carefully create soundscapes of mellow and precisely engineered beauty – as well as wild builds of tension and tempestuous climaxes. The trio have performed widely, at venues and events ranging from Glastonbury to folk clubs and living rooms. Moore Moss Rutter were winners of the BBC Radio 2 Young Folk Award 2011.
