

<u>Paediatric First Aid – Level 3 – Qualification</u> <u>2-Day Course – (Minimum of 12 hours)</u>

Course Information:

Unit 1 – Emergency Paediatric First Aid Unit 2 – Managing Paediatric illness, injury and emergencies

The qualification is designed for learners with a responsibility for the care of children and babies and provides the knowledge and skills to be able to deal with a range of Paediatric first aid conditions and incidents.

The purpose of the qualification is for the learner to attain the knowledge and practical competence required to deal with a range of Paediatric First Aid situations.

Ofsted and the Early Years Foundation Stage

This two-day qualification fulfils the requirements for first aid training detailed in the Department for Education's statutory framework for the Early Years Foundation Stage.

Duration:

Total qualification Time (TQT) is 15 hours, with at least 12 Guided Learning Hours (GLH) in the classroom over a minimum of 2 days plus independent pre and post course study. The qualification can be delivered over a maximum of a 6-week period with each training session being a minimum of 2 hours.

Certification:

The learner is assessed both through practical demonstration and written assessment.

The qualification is valid for three years from the date of achievement. It is recommended that the learner attends annual refresher training. The learner will need to complete the full course again to requalify for a further three years.

- Allergic reactions including anaphylaxis

- Diabetic emergencies
- Asthma
- Meningitis
- Febrile convulsions
- Extreme cold and heat
- Electrical incidents
