## ★ Why is 1st of May, the Workers' Day?

On 1st May workers around the world stand up for their rights and celebrate their culture.

Celebrating May Day as International Workers' Day began as a commemoration of the Chicago Haymarket massacre on **1st May** 1886, when strikers and police were killed and four protest leaders were hung after 300.000 workers walked off the job for an 8-hour day.

**Wolverhampton Trades Council organised the first** local May Day rally six years later in 1892, with 7,000 people attending.

That original struggle for the 8-hour work day continued in Britain. In 1932. Ernest Bevin, General Secretary of the Transport and General Workers' Union came to Wolverhampton to sign an historic agreement with Mander Brothers Paints, to become the first UK company to introduce the 40-hour week.

Yet after nearly another century of capitalism, many are still forced to work more hours to try and make ends meet and twenty food banks currently in Wolverhampton shows many can't.

## Capitalism isn't working.
