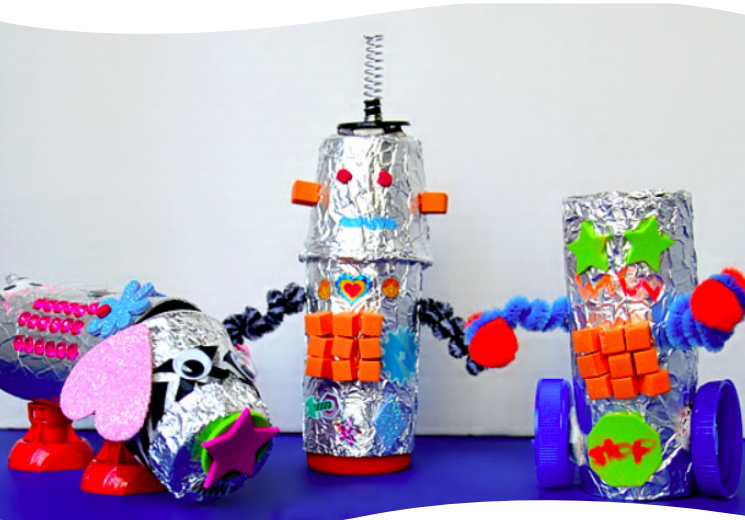




# SHOW THEME 2025

Summer radishes are ready to harvest in as little as 4 weeks. Grow them in an old yoghurt pot – reuse in action!

Other fun and easy to grow veg are spring onions, beans and mini cabbages.



Decorated cakes and biscuits are a great way to get creative in the run-up to the show. Keep children busy during the holidays, perfecting their baking skills for the final entry.

Sunflowers and other garden flowers make impressive displays in the flower arranging category.



Have a look at our arts & crafts categories and see what you can create from second-hand materials, or natural materials like leaves, twigs and pebbles.

If you don't have space for your bird box or feeder, we'll make sure it's put to use in the Park or a local garden via the auction.

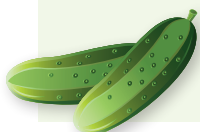


# SHOW CATEGORIES AND HOW TO ENTER

We welcome entries from anyone who visits the show. Entry is free! Whether you're an individual, a school, an allotment group, or any other local organisation, you're welcome to enter. You can display in as many or as few categories as you like.

It's easy to enter your homegrown and homemade produce in our show. If you can, please register by 5th September on the form overleaf or via our web-site.

Fruit and vegetable categories are limited to a maximum of 6 judged entries.  
**You may display more than 6, they just won't be judged.**



## A: HOME PRODUCE

- A1: Jam
  - A2: Chutney/Pickles
  - A3: Scones (3)
  - A4: Biscuits (3)
  - A5: Cake (any)
  - A6: Cake (decorated)
  - A7: Under 5's - 3 decorated (shop bought) biscuits
  - A8: Cake (to given recipe)
- These categories are judged separately for Junior entries (Under 16)*

## B: ARTS & CRAFTS

- Art-pencil, pastel, paint (max 2 entries) or Photography (max 2 entries) themed '**Reduce, Reuse, Recycle**'
- B1: Art
  - B2: Photography - Theme: Reduce, Reuse, Recycle
  - B3: Sewing/embroidery
  - B4: Vegetable creature
  - B5: Animal/bird house/bird feeder
  - B6: Knitting
  - B7: Crochet
  - B8: Junk modelling
  - B9: Other crafts

- E4: 3 Chrysanthus (stems or sprays)
- E5: Vase of mixed flowers
- E6: Flower Arrangement
- E7: Potted plant
- E8: Cactus/succulent
